Find teachers that teach the subjects our scholarships are focused on (social studies, history, healthcare, and industrial technology) and hand them the scholarship information to share with their students. If you need help, contact me and I will make a handout you can share in an email or print out and physically give them (as soon as I have all the scholarship details).
- Flag Day Is June 14 every year. However, you could pick any day to educate children about the flag and patriotism. Emblem Sales has a "Let's Be Right on Flag Etiquette" that you could donate to the schools.

Remember to keep track of what you do so you can include it in your mid-year and annual reports. And, as always, be branded and take lots of pictures!



It doesn't seem possible that another year is upon us. I look forward to bringing info back from National to add to the training I already have planned.

The Legislative program is in place to support the public policy positions of The American Legion (TAL), which disseminates material relating to issues involving veterans' health care, program funding, and troop and family support.

I encourage all Unit Presidents and Legislative Chairs, as well as any interested members, to sign up for this material as follows:

- 1. Go to www.legion.org/legislative.
- 2. Scroll down about half the page to the eight photos and click on the middle one in the middle row, captioned "Grassroots Action Center."
- 3. Here you can "Sign Up for Alerts."

- 4. Not comfortable signing up? Then scroll down and click on any legislation which is important to you. You can either compose your own message to Congress, or you can simply fill out the information on the right-hand side and click "Send Message" to send the Legion Family's position directly to Nebraska's Congressional representatives.
- 5. From that same page listed in #1 above, you can also click on the middle photo in the top row, captioned "Legislative Agenda & Point Papers." You can review any of the Point Papers or scroll down to see the 2025 Legislative Priorities. These are likely to change somewhat for 2026.
- 6. Download the guide at www.legion-aux.org/member/guides/advocacy-guide.
- 7. Consider listening to a podcast at www.legion.org/tangoalphalima.

Remember that one voice may not make a difference on its own, but by joining together, ALA members can make a difference when we advocate for America's veterans. So let's work together over the coming year to serve America's veterans well.

As we gear up for the end of 2025, I ask that each one of you take a look at the VA&R schedule that is included in this newsletter and put the dates for the facilities close to you on your calendar. Dollar Days, Gifts for Yanks, and Gift Shop will be held in November and December, and we NEED you to come and attend. Our veterans and their spouses in the facilities love to have as many visitors as possible during these events.

Dollar Days is held around Veterans Day and each veteran in the Nebraska homes and hospitals receives a \$10 gift to thank them for their service. Gifts for Yanks is held each December at all of the Nebraska homes and hospitals and at the Cheyenne and Hot Springs VA Hospitals. Each veteran will receive a \$30 gift and a calendar and any spouse living in the facility will receive a \$25 and a calendar for a Christmas gift. Gift Shop is held at the two Nebraska hospitals and each veteran is able to choose 3 or 4 gifts that they can either give to their immediate family or keep for themselves for Christmas. The amount of joy on the veterans faces at each of these events will make you want to keep coming back year after year to help.

VA&R is one of our largest programs and it takes all of our members working together to support it. There is a contact list for all of the chairs and representatives at the facilities, so please reach out to them if you would like to help with any events or have them send you when events are going to be held.

- 2. The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count. 3. Each poster must include a red poppy.
- 4. The department shall determine the closing date of the unit contest. The poster shall be on 11x14" poster board. (Drawing paper will not be accepted).
- 5. The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.
- 6. Posters will be judged using the following criteria: 50% poster appeal (layout, message, originality) 40% artistic ability (design and color) 10% neatness
- 7. Media used shall be watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils, and markers.
- 8. Written in ink on the back of the poster (not attached) shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age, and grade of the contestant and the name of the department.
- 9. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.
- 10. The poster shall be the work of only one individual.
- 11. The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran-made poppy may not be used.
- 12. The poster must have cover sheet attached to it when submitted.
