Key dates for the American Legion Auxiliary in November

- Marine Corps Birthday (November 10): Many American Legion Family members celebrate the Marine Corps' founding on this day.
- Buddy Check Week (Around Veterans Day): This initiative encourages American Legion Family members to contact and check in on fellow veterans and their families.

- American Education Week (November 17-21): This observance is a time to honor those who work in public schools. The Auxiliary supports programs for youth and education, making this a relevant celebration.
- Thanksgiving (November 27): Some Auxiliary units and posts host special dinners for veterans, service members, first responders, and their families.

If you attended your District's Fall Round Up and participated in the M & M activity, you helped. Thank you!



American Education Week happens the week prior to the week of Thanksgiving, November 17 - 21, 2025. Festivities honor the team of people who work in our nation's public schools, everyone from the bus driver and classroom teacher to the cafeteria worker, coaches, and administrative staff.

This is a perfect time to engage with our schools! Tell them about the American Legion Auxiliary as well as share your Unit program information. Besides a "thank you," let this be a conversation on how you can work together to improve communication and build a relationship to work on other projects. For example, Veterans Day programs, essay and poster contests, scholarships, Girls State, etc.

Some ideas on how to honor educators include:

- Make thank you notes and provide treats
- "Give 10 for Education" ask what they need, not always school supplies
- Donate books to educate about patriotism, Veterans, poppies, etc.
- Give them a flag and flag etiquette book to use as a classroom resource
- Honor staff who are veterans
- Host an open house at your post to honor staff
- Volunteer at events they may be having that week
- If your post has a marquee sign outside, ask them to post a sign or message supporting this cause, showing your community connection
- Post a positive message on social media platforms as well as local media

This week I have been working with Zero percent Units. Please do not hold your memberships. The only way a member can be a member is by submitting membership to the Department to be registered or by paying dues online. Members expect to be part of the organization when they pay their dues.

One reason to have continuous membership in the American Legion Auxiliary:

*Auxiliary Emergency Fund - a member's dues must be current and have maintained continuous membership for at least 3 years to apply for a Hardship grant or Disaster Assistance.

Unit Awards

There will be a Drawing for the following:

- **25% Award** On the SAL Birthday, September 15, we had 78 Units eligible for this award. We drew two Units- Tilden # 170 and Farnum #288 and each unit received \$25.
- **60% Awards** by ALA Birthday, November 10, 2025

National Veterans & Military Family Month

Veterans & Military Families Month was established in 1996 by the Armed Services YMCA, with the U.S. Government recognizing the occasion every year since. Each November, the President signs a proclamation declaring November National Veterans & Military Families Month, and with hundreds of thousands of service members deployed overseas, recognizing the daily sacrifices made by active duty, Guard, and Reserve military families has never been more important.

There are so many ways for our members to help make the active-duty military members, veterans, and their families feel remembered and cared for. Here are some ideas:

- Download a 'Military Family Month' packet from the Armed Services YMCA at www.asymca.org.
- Share the Sesame Street for Military Families Free App.
- Tell Military families about Operation Kid Comfort where their children can get a free custom-made photo transfer quilt or pillow.
- Home Depot offers a 10% in-store discount for those with valid military ID, but the
 company is also recognized as an important employer of military spouses. A Home
 Depot employee-run resource called Military Appreciation Group, "is dedicated strictly
 to supporting active military associates, deployed reservists and their families"
 according to the Home Depot official site.
- Donate Thanksgiving meals to military members and their families through the USO-Metro's Turkeys for Troops and the ASYMCA's Operation Holiday Joy.
- Create Care Packages for both service members and their families with items that would help either ease stress during a deployment.
- Adopt-a-Soldier for the Holidays through local programs.
- Thank an Active-Duty Member, Veteran, Military Spouse, or Military Child for their service.
- Fly the U.S. Flag.
- Visit a veteran receiving care in a VA hospital, Veterans Home, or nursing home.
- Offer to volunteer childcare or dog sitting to a military or veteran neighbor to get errands accomplished or to even enjoy a few hours to recharge.
- When you see someone in uniform be sure to thank them for their service or surprise them with a free coffee, dessert, or drink if they are in line behind you.

Each year on Veteran's Day, November 11, we acknowledge and appreciate our veterans of the past and present for their noble and brave service to our nation. We offer our gratitude for their sacrifice and for the security and protection of our freedoms. Even the smallest of gestures make a difference to our military members, veterans, and their families.
