For the new 2025 membership year you can begin submitting current members after August 1 and new applications after September 1. I have a few requests. It is all earthfriendly to use up all those old copies of data forms and transmittal sheets you have at home, but when it comes to getting the correct information needed into Department, only the most current forms ask for that information. On the data forms we always need the membership numbers. Especially if the person is transferring. Old data forms don't ask for the complete number. Time for them to go into the recycle bin. All previous transmittal forms are obsolete. Please throw out old forms that have the dues transmittal amount of \$22.25 on them. It confuses the preparer and me if the wrong amount is submitted because that is what you are seeing on the form. Recycle. Dues into Department are \$30.25 per Senior member and anything else submitted will get you a phone call. Use the new forms that will be in your membership packets at the Convention. Proper forms omit phone calls from the Department.

Here's some pointers on filling out a membership application. They must be on the current application form. This is the form that does not have great-granddaughter as the relationship to the veteran. We all know by now that they are no longer eligible. All the information for the veterans, including their American Legion membership ID number, must be included, and ALL the correct signatures must be on there. The applicant or parent/guardian must sign the application. The POST ADJUTANT – not the Unit Membership Chair – must sign the veteran eligibility section. Please don't send them expecting the Department to take care of these things. You may receive it back if it is incomplete. The application should not be used for a previous member renewal. Those need to go on the transmittal sheet with the word "rejoin" written somewhere with their name. I could go on, but I think what you should get out of this is if you are unsure about something, please call us and ask the question. It saves a lot of time.

I hope you have plans to get to the Convention in Kearney June 20-23. President Lisa will say her thankyous for a wonderful year, chairs will report on Unit accomplishments, we will usher in a new year with a new president, and lots of other fun stuff! It's always nice to see old friends and meet new ones.

MEMBERSHIP

Upon becoming a Unit President in the fall of 2014, I began my year by attending a Leadership Training at which several Department Committee Chairs spoke, including Barbie Meyer, whom we all know as a Past Department President, but who was at that time the Membership Chair. She was funny and engaging (isn't she always?), and yet I still remember thinking, "That has to be the worst job there is. I would NEVER want to do that." Fast forward nine years, and I found myself becoming Nebraska's Membership Chair, proving that (a) "never say never," and (b) there is always room for growth.

Thank you, Pony Express Riders, for proving yourselves to be "**Nebraska Strong and Faithful by Serving Veterans Always**." Here are some highlights from the past year:

- 34 Units from all 13 Districts in Nebraska turned in reports. Your numbers included:
 - 97 volunteers worked on membership (nearly 3 members per reporting Unit)
 - 1,498 volunteer hours on membership were reported (nearly 15 hours per volunteer and 44 hours per Unit)
 - \$875 was spent on membership (\$25 per reporting Unit)
- As of this writing, eight Units have reached 100% for membership: Bayard Unit #200, Craig Unit #127, Hayes Center Unit #287, Hemingford Unit #9, Howells Unit #155, Oxford Unit #219, Plymouth Unit #243, and Syracuse Unit #100.

Nebraskans used many standard methods of renewing, recruiting, and rejoining membership, including letters, phone calls, information tables at events, and publishing information in local newspapers. But innovative techniques were tapped as well:

Cody Unit #319 held a Back-to-School Potluck Dinner for their local school's faculty and administration, to which the entire community was invited. The publicity for the event included a notation that any current or new Auxiliary members who paid their dues by the date of the picnic would have their names entered into a

drawing for gift cards to local businesses. This Unit renewed 23 members and joined 4 new ones, as well as discovering 3 prospective members.

Gretna Unit #216 assigned a theme to each month's meeting. August was "Membership" month, at which the Unit went out to dinner in lieu and listened to a dual member give a presentation on her time in Iraq and Afghanistan. In September, the theme was "History," and each member was encouraged to bring a photo and tell the story of his/her veteran. After hearing all these wonderful accounts, who would not want to pay their dues?

Some Units chose to reward members as a recruitment tool. For example, Auxiliary pins were provided to new members and/or certificates given to members reaching milestones for continuous membership. A few Units chose to pay the dues for any aging members who were no longer able to do so. My personal favorite was the Unit who presented a quilt to a member reaching 50 years of membership.

Way to go, Pony Express Riders! You can all be proud of your work.


POPPY
