#### CONVENTION AUCTION

I have been asked to explain what is paid with the funds from the Convention Auction. It is my understanding that the auction began because the District needed additional funds. Our only other income is the per capita dues and what we receive from Convention and Fall Round-Up. The District treasury receives half of the registration fees collected at the event – the other half goes to the local Unit. The fee for the meal – at Convention – pays for the meal. That does not bring in much money. Registration fee is \$5.00. Attendance at Fall Round-Up is approximately 35 members and at Convention approximately 45 members.

The receipts from the auction go to the treasury and is then dispursed to many places. There are Veterans homes and medical facilities, there is the National President's project, the Department President's project, the Department Honorary Junior President's project, the District President's project, Little Red Schoolhouse, AEF, State Life members, etc. And then of course, the balance to help keep the District running – paper for the newsletter, envelopes, postage, etc.

In the recent past, the District President has also held an individual raffle to help with their project. One year the raffle was a quilt, and the proceeds went to the project of donations to the AEF. The raffle paid for the quilt, the tickets, and what was needed to get the quilt where it needed to be.

When you donate an item to the Convention Auction, you are donating to the American Legion Auxiliary. You are supporting the causes that the Auxiliary believes in. If you purchase an item, you continue to add to the funds used for all of the donations that you, as a group, decide to donate to.

A list of these donations will be available in your program for the Convention. If you wish to change these donations, the membership votes for it. Your DEC makes recommendations, but you, the member, make the final decision.

#### CONVENTION INFORMATION

The change from the Fairbury Unit to the Crete Unit has some logistical issues. You will need to enter the bar side of the Club.

Registration table will be there, the landing in front of the bar will hold the Prayer Books, the History Books, the Poppy Centerpieces and the Auction items. Although it is not a large area, it should hold our items and still allow individuals to check out the auction items.

All joint Legion and Auxiliary events will be held on the bar side of the Club. The Joint Meeting will begin at 10:00 a.m. After the meeting is the Memorial Services and then we will have the Auction prior to lunch.

If you are wondering why there are changes, the other side of the building is being used that morning. That event should be finished before 1:00 p.m. and the Auxiliary will then move to that side of the Club.

I thank Gerry Johnson, Crete President, for all of her knowledge and help in this change of venue. I also thank Sylvia Cloyd, Fairbury President, for being there for me as well.

Elections will be held at the Convention. The Nominating Committee will present the candidates that have been nominated. There will still be nominations from the floor. Counties will break into their groups and decide who they want to vote for. These ballots are given to Parliamentarian Deb Albers for counting. That tally will be presented to the members.

Although this is not my last newsletter, I want to thank everyone for their support during my two-year tenure as president. It has been an honor and a privilege to hold this position. I have met many members, have been to quite a few Unit meetings and County meetings. I have always felt welcome. But then again, we ARE in Nebraska.
